

Theme: Give Love on Christmas Day: My Wish to Santa Claus

SLIDE 6: Inspire empathy by illustrating how their generosity can bring happiness to less fortunate children, highlighting the positive impact of helping others.

SLIDE 7: Guide students on various ways they can contribute, emphasizing the word '**donating**' in yellow for emphasis.

SLIDE 8: Similarly, emphasize the significance of supporting **homeless people** through donations, the word is highlighted in yellow for emphasis and for translation. Highlight the term 'donating' once again, this time for both emphasis and translation.

SLIDE 9: Explain the worksheet. Clarify the upcoming activity with an explanation of the worksheet, ensuring students understand the purpose behind their efforts.

SLIDE 10: Play the music video while the students write their letter to Santa, incorporating the spirit of giving into their wishes.

Duration: Aim for a 15-minute duration to maintain engagement and focus.

Conclusion: By participating in this activity, students not only grasp the significance of giving but also internalize the importance of helping those in need. They're basically turning into Christmas superheroes—spreading love, sharing, and looking out for others. It's not just about their own holiday happiness; it's about making a real difference for kids, even adults who could use a hand.
